According to the pie chart, it is seen that there is a gap between 1950 and 2010 what has decreased in 1950 and 2010 will be discussed according to the pie chart.

In 1950, the majority of household expenditure was allocated to housing (34.0%) followed by food (22.0%). Health care and education constituted smaller proportions at 6.6% and 2.4%, respectively. Transportation accounted for 11.2% while other categories collectively represented 3.3%.

By 2010, there were notable changes in spending patterns. Housing remained a significant expense, increasing to 36.3% while food saw a slight decrease to 19.2%. Health care and education experienced substantial increases to 11.2% and 6.3% respectively. Transportation also rose to 14.0%. The other category showed a notable decrease to 3.3%.

Comparing the percentages from 1990 to 2010:

Housing, increased from 22.0% to 34.0%, indicating a significant rise in housing expenditure. Food, 33.3% to 19.2% suggesting a relative decrease in the proportion spent on food.

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Health, 2.4% to 6.3% indicating an increase in health expenditure. Education, 11.2% to 19.2% suggesting a higher percentage of household spending on education. Transportation, 6.6% to 11.2%, showing an upward trend in transportation expenditure. Other, decreased from 19.2% to 4.5% indicating a decrease in the proportion allocated to other.

From the above discussion it is clear that 1950 housing, food, healthcare, education, transportation some decrease in 2010 some increase which we see in discussion of pie chart
