① There are five type of sentences.

① Assertive Sentence: An assertive sentence, also known as a declarative sentence, states a fact, opinion, or idea. It is used to make a statement and typically ends with a period.

Example: The sky is blue.

② Interrogative Sentence: An interrogative sentence is used to ask a question. It typically begins with a question word (who, what, where, when, why, how) or an auxiliary verb (is, are, am, do) and ends with a question mark.

Example: Are you coming to the party?

③ Imperative sentence: An imperative sentence gives a command, makes a request, or offers advice. It often begins with the verb and can end with a period or exclamation mark.

Example: Close the door.

④ Optative sentence: An optative sentence expresses a wish, hope, or prayer. It often starts with "may" or "wish" and ends with a period or an exclamation mark.

Example: may you have a long and happy life!

⑤ Exclamatory sentence: An Exclamatory sentence expresses strong emotion or excitement. It conveys intensity and ends with an exclamation mark.

Example: what a wonderful surprise!

① Noun phrase:  $\varphi$

Function: A noun phrase is a group of words that have a noun or pronoun. It is to modify the noun. In other words, it can be said that a noun phrase can function as a subject, an object or a complement in a sentence.

② Adjective

Adjective phrase:

Function: An adjective phrase or an adjectival phrase is a group of words that consists of an adjective. It can be used to complement it. It provides more information about the noun or pronoun in a sentence. In other words, it can be said that it functions just like an adjective in a sentence.

③ Adverb phrase:

Function: An adverb phrase or an adverbial phrase is a group of words that includes an adverb and other modifiers. It performs all the functions of an adverb. It can be placed in any part of the sentence, with respect to the part of speech they modify.

④ verb phrase:

Function: A verb phrase can be used just like a verb. it can consist of a main verb and an auxiliary verb.

⑤ prepositional phrase:

Function: A prepositional phrase consists of a preposition and object. It works just like an adjective or an adverb. it relates the subject and the verb in a sentence. it is used to modify the nouns and verbs in a particular sentence.
